LOLLY the TROLLEY

More than 20 miles of facts and fun are covered in Trolley Tours' well known City Sightseeing Tour. The comprehensive 1 and 2 hour narrated tours include The Flats, a river port where the Cuyahoga River meets Lake Erie; Cleveland's North Coast Harbor featuring the world's only Rock & Roll Hall of Fame and Museum and the Great Lakes Science Center; Downtown Cleveland, with its mix of historic and modern architecture; The Warehouse District with loft apartments, restaurants & galleries in downtown's oldest and newest "neighborhood"; Ohio City, with both Victorian homes renovated by "urban homesteaders" and the West Side Market, one of the world's largest indoor/outdoor food and produce markets; the Gateway Sports complex; Playhouse Square, the nation's largest theater restoration project and 2nd largest performing arts center; The Cleveland Clinic, one of America's premier medical centers, University Circle, a focal point for our cultural, educational and medical institutions and a drive through the historic Cultural Gardens, saluting the ethnic groups who have built our community. Your 2 Hour Tour concludes with a brief stop at the Rockefeller Greenhouse and a return to town along the Lake Erie shoreline back to the trolley station.

Prices are \$11.00 for the 1 hour tour and \$17.00 for the 2 hour tour.

NOTE: The 1 Hour Tour concludes after the Gateway Complex and returns to the station. Sightseeing tours are non-stop with the 2 Hour Tour offering just a single short stop at the Greenhouse. All public tours depart from Trolley Tours ticket desk in the Powerhouse at Nautica on the West Bank of Cleveland's Flats, a 5 minute taxi ride from our hotel. The Powerhouse is a large red brick building with the words "Rock Bottom Brewery" mounted on the outside. Trolley Tours is at the top of the first flight of stairs in the building near the Rock Bottom entrance.

Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and Museum

The celebrated rock legends—bands, songwriters, producers and DJs—are honored in Cleveland's one and only Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and Museum. The I.M. Pei-designed glass building dramatically overlooking Lake Erie holds treasures that range from Jimi Hendrix's handwritten lyrics to Tina Turner's memorable concert costumes, plus a variety of concert posters, ticket stubs, stage gear, handbills and much, much more. The Rock Hall is a 10 minute walk from the hotel or a 4 minute taxi ride.

You are bound to get lost in the museum's fascinating archive of song clips, film montages, interviews and other media focused on the roots and evolution of rock and roll. Be forewarned, while there is metered street parking in front of the museum and you might feel you've lucked upon "rock star" parking, you may want to stay at the Rock Hall for more than the meter's allotted two hours.

Great Lakes Science Center

Near the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, the Great Lakes Science Center has hundreds of hands-on, minds-on exhibits. The Science Center features:

Science Phenomena Floor - Explore the science of light, optics, sound, resonance, motion, mechanics, electricity, magnetism and weather. Some featured exhibits include:

- **Indoor Tornado** -learn what is needed to form a tornado and stick your hand in the middle of the whirling cyclone!
- **Shadow Room** - experience the phenomenon of photoluminescence when the flash of a strobe light freezes your shadow against the wall!
- **Bridge of Fire** - a static generator generates 200,000 volts of electric current, causing the shortest hair to stand on end!

NASA Glenn Visitor Center - The new official site of the NASA Glenn Visitor Center. Phase One is currently open and features 20 artifacts including shuttle and rocket models, a moon rock, a lunar lander model.

OMNIMAX® Theater - Experience movie magic on a giant screen that's six stories high.

Biomedical Technology Gallery - Covering everything from stem cells to MRIs to robotic arms.

Polymer Funhouse - Just for those 7 and under, the young ones can bounce around in the ball pit.

Terminal Tower and Tower City

The Terminal Tower is a landmark skyscraper located on Public Square, a 3 minute walk from our hotel. Built during the skyscraper boom of the 1920s and 1930s, it was the second tallest building in the world when it was completed. Until 1964, the Terminal Tower stood as the tallest building in North America outside of New York City.

Terminal Tower is the home of Tower City, with over 100 specialty shops, six full-service restaurants, 11-screen theater, Time Warner Cable Amphitheater at

Tower City, 2 Hotels and easy access through a connected walkway to Progressive Field and Quicken Loans Arena.

The Old Arcade

The Arcade runs the length of the block between Euclid Avenue and Superior Avenue at E. 4th St. The building consists of two brick, 9-story towers -- one at either end -- and a 5-story glass and metal atrium with a 100 foot skylight ceiling connecting the two. The atrium is decorated with extensive metalwork and the atrium's top floor features a row of gargoyles.

The structure, said to be modeled after the *Galleria Vittorio Emanuele* in Milan, Italy, was the first Cleveland building to be added to the National Register of Historic Places (in 1975). The Arcade is considered to be one of the first indoor shopping malls in the United States. This is the home of the Hyatt Regency Hotel and the site of the President's Dinner.

Cleveland Public Library

The Main Library in downtown Cleveland consists of the historic Main Library Building built in 1925 and renovated in 1999; the Louis Stokes Wing completed in 1997; and the Eastman Reading Garden between the two buildings. The two buildings and the garden take up an entire city block on Superior Avenue between East 3rd Street and East 6th Street. The Main Library's Subject Departments are divided between the two buildings.

The landmark Main Building underwent a \$24 million renovation in 1999 with sensitivity to the building's architectural integrity while incorporating new technologies. Demonstrating the Library's continuing support for the visual arts, the Library Board commissioned a substantial collection of permanent art to be included in the buildings and garden. Thirteen artists of local and national reputation created original art for the Main Library, the Louis Stokes Wing, and the Eastman Reading Garden. Selected by a jury coordinated with the Committee for Public Art, the art works are significant additions to the Library's and the city's artistic heritage.

Today, the Cleveland Public Library circulates one of the largest and most extensive collections in the country, boasting close to ten million items.

Old Stone Church

The Old Stone Church on Public Square has twice been devastated by fire, in 1858 and 1884. The restored church was dedicated on October 19, 1884, and a local report stated: "The heavy iron-hinged doors were thrown open, and all who thronged the service were dazzled by a scene of magnificence far exceeding their highest expectations."

The restored Old Stone Church is essentially what you see today. Schweinfurth changed the interior layout, eliminating the center aisle and creating an imposing barrel-vaulted ceiling supported by two false clerestories. Especially notable are stained glass windows installed over a period from 1885 to 1976 and the magnificent organ. There are four Louis C. Tiffany stained glass windows and a magnificent John La Farge triple window overlooking Public Square. The present organ was built by the famed Cleveland Holtkamp Organ Company and was installed in 1976 within the beautiful casework of an 1895 William Johnson organ.

The Old Stone Church is located steps from our hotel, in the Northwest quadrant of Public Square at the intersection of Rockwell and Ontario Streets. During office hours, when the sanctuary doors are closed, visitors may enter the church through the Ontario Street entrance.

OHIO CITY

One of Cleveland's oldest neighborhoods, and perhaps its most ethnically diverse, is Ohio City, a culturally rich community located just across the Cuyahoga River from downtown Cleveland. Like everything else, it is a 5 minute taxi ride from our hotel. Originally home to Irish and German immigrants, Ohio City today is home to more than 15 ethnic groups representing more than 10,000 people. Chock-full of historic homes and commercial buildings, new condos and townhouses, unique shops and some of the area's hottest restaurants and nightspots, Ohio City is a premier neighborhood in the City of Cleveland.

WEST SIDE MARKET

Opened in 1912, the West Side Market is Cleveland's oldest publicly-owned market. The historic venue was originally created as a neighborhood ethnic market; however, it also is a fun daytrip destination for locals and out-of-towners. It is considered to be one of the finest markets in the country.

Restaurants, prepared food stands, meat, poultry, seafood, produce and flowers can all be found at the market, which houses quality groceries sold at affordable prices.

TREMONT

Tremont is another quaint neighborhood in the City of Cleveland, Ohio. The proverbial 5 minute taxi ride from the hotel, Tremont is one of the oldest parts of Cleveland, and is home to restaurants (such as Zack Bruell's Parallax and Michael Symon's Lolita Bistro) and art and gift galleries such as Geode at 755 Starkweather Avenue. The district sits just west of the Cuyahoga River and south of the Ohio City neighborhood. The neighborhood is enjoying a revival thanks to an influx of new residents, including young professionals, empty nesters and immigrants attracted to the neighborhood's amenities, historic housing stock and new infill housing.

Two well-known movies, *The Deer Hunter* and *A Christmas Story*, were partially filmed in Tremont.

UNIVERSITY CIRCLE

University Circle is Cleveland's cultural center. Located at the intersection of Martin Luther King Jr. Drive, Carnegie Boulevard, and Euclid Avenue, a 10 minute taxi from our hotel, this area is home to museums, such as the venerable Cleveland Museum of Art and the Western Reserve Historical Society, colleges and universities, including Case Western Reserve University and the Cleveland Institute of Music, and landscaped green spaces, such as Wade Oval and Rockefeller Park.

The area is centered around Wade Oval, a tract of land donated to the city by turn-of-the-century business tycoon, Jeptha Wade. It is also home to the Cleveland Botanical Garden and some tasty and diverse restaurants, coffee shops, and nightspots.

A free shuttle circles the area every fifteen minutes and makes stops at all of the area attractions.

Cleveland Botanical Garden

For seventy-five years, Cleveland Botanical Garden has been one of Northeast Ohio's treasures. With beautiful facilities and innovative programming, the Garden reaches out to every segment of the community. Cleveland Botanical Garden has extended its reach far beyond Northeast Ohio, becoming a national leader in urban horticulture, horticultural therapy and environmental education.

The History Museum

The History Center features two historic mansions. The Bingham-Hanna Mansion features galleries of rotating exhibitions. (The Hay-McKinney Mansion is currently closed for preservation. Please call 216-721-5722 for updated information.)

The Chisholm Halle Costume Wing is always dressed to the nines with more than 30,000 items to choose from for rotating exhibitions. The Chisholm Halle Costume Collection is one of the top-ranked costume collections in the nation, showcasing garments from the late 1700s to the present.

Crawford Auto Aviation Museum

The Crawford Auto Aviation Museum presents the history of land and air transportation. The Museum collects and preserves historically and technically important automobiles, aircraft, bicycles, motorcycles, spacecraft and related accessories and archival materials that illustrate the development of transportation and its connection to the culture and history of Northeast Ohio, the United States and the world. The Museum showcases antique, vintage, and classic automobiles, motorcycles, bicycles, automobile culture and a dozen historically significant airplanes.

The Library/Archives & Genealogy Center

The Library is a principal repository for histories, records, and papers relating to the growth and development of Cleveland and the Western Reserve. Many patrons visit to learn about their family's history; and important archival collections include urban, African American, ethnic, Jewish, and Labor histories.

PETER B. LEWIS – FRANK GEHRY BUILDING

The Peter B. Lewis Building, home of the School of Management at Case Western Reserve University, was designed by the world famous architect, Frank Gehry.

This structure, which is a powerful, compact sculpture as well as a functioning building, is perhaps this visionary architect's most succinct and dramatic creation. The waterfall of stainless steel plates that compose the roof can be seen as representing the onslaught of new business needs in our rapidly-changing global economy. The brick walls, symbolic of traditional ways of conducting business, do not collapse under the impact of these waves, but respond and adapt in graceful curves. The extraordinary manipulation of iron, brick, glass, wood and drywall, evident in the construction of both the inside and the outside of this building, is testimony to the skill, innovation, and imagination of those companies and individuals who worked together in transforming Frank Gehry's state-of-the-art design into reality.

LITTLE ITALY

Little Italy (known locally as "Murray Hill" or "The Hill") is an ethnic neighborhood in Cleveland that is the historic center of the city's Italian American community. A 12 minute taxi from our hotel, Little Italy is situated at the city's eastern edge, on a long, moderately sloping walkable grade that runs up from University Circle to suburban Cleveland Heights, a rise in elevation of approximately 300 feet. The intersection of Mayfield Road and Murray Hill Road marks the neighborhood's epicenter, with the east–west boundaries being roughly East 126th Street to East 119th Street, Lake View Cemetery to the north, and the Case Western Reserve University campus to the south.

In addition to its great restaurants, Little Italy is home to many art galleries. Call for hours.
